Major Health Concerns

Cavalier King Charles Spaniels can often suffer from some serious genetic health problems including earlyonset <u>mitral valve disease</u>. They are also prone to <u>hip dysplasia</u>, luxating patellas and various vision and hearing disorders.

King Charles Spaniels were interbred with Pugs to get the modern day Cavalier King Charles Spaniel.

This breed is also known to have a constantly wagging tail, one of the deisred features of the breed.
